

Millcreek Township Monthly Meeting for July 15th, 2026

Vice-Chairman, Fred Brandstetter called the Wednesday, July 15, 2026, meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. followed by the pledge of allegiance. Two supervisors were present along with three township residents. June meeting minutes read and approved with Fred making the motion, John seconding motion. June's treasurers' report presented and accepted by the supervisors. treasurers' report the Farmers CD balance \$943.20. Escrow Account is \$5637.00 ATV application deposits \$115.00 with ending balance of \$5752.00. General Fund beginning balance was \$159,211.94 total debits \$19,919.07 total credits \$19,562.70 interest for the month \$2.82 for the year \$15.18 ending balance \$158,855.57. Liquid Fuels account beginning balance is \$153,000.58 total debits \$8,588.75 interest for the month \$2.61 for the year \$13.42 ending balance \$144,448.44. Top Tier Federal Credit Union 3.85% 6month CD beginning balance \$121,297.51 interest for the month \$376.85 ending balance \$121,674.36 2026. The treasurers' report was accepted as presented. Discussion took place about the C.D. at Top Tier to keep money in another C.D.

Discussion took place about not receiving a bill from IA Construction due to the fact that they were bought by Hawbakkers.

Public Comments: 5 minutes per person: During Homecoming and the Gun Raffle Fire Drive will be shut down and signs will be placed on each end. The berms On Zaghts road will done end of year.

Old Business: House Bill 2274, which was reported out of the Committee on Transportation with amendments, proposes a statutory speed limit of 35 mph for unpaved surfaces. The bill now moves to the full House for further consideration.

New Business: Road update: Starter went out of Roller. CCATO meeting is September 17th Fred and John are both going to attend. Discussion took place on starting a Safety committee to reduce Our workers' compensation premiums by 5%. We would need three from members from the township and three members from the Fire Company. Meet monthly for six months before applying for the reduction. Local Share Account (LSA) grant discussion took place on items that we need getting quotes. Fred and John will work on getting quotes. Grant opens up September 1st and closes November 30th. John led the discussion about the meeting he attended. He met Trisha Mazik and Brett Whitling and their discussion about equipment that the township needs. Discussion took place on the truck Clarion Township has for sale. This truck could potentially replace our red International truck that 4 garages have worked on. Discussion on the events of July 4th when large trees fell down on Blyson. John Cox and Jake Spangler worked for hours to clean up the downed trees. The township will reimburse John for his chainsaw chain. Alan from Matson Lumbar then removed the trees. Discussion then took place on rattlesnakes and that they are on the move at this time. Three rattlesnake bits in Pa and they can travel 5 miles from their den. 2025 Audit summary revenues \$371,220.00 total expenditures \$280,654.00 excess over expenditures \$90,566. January 2025 balance \$248,534.00 December 2025 balance \$399,100.00 and will be posted on the website.

Secretary/Treasurer Update: Banking, reconcile QuickBooks, payroll, bill paying, mail, filing, finished up Liquid Fuels audit items needed, 2nd Quarter Reports, several phone calls about building in the township and ATV permits.
